Middle School U Basics

Program Location: Middle School U is based at Centennial Park 901 S. Holiday Drive, Waunakee, WI 53597. The week of July 19-23 classes will be held at an alternate Waunakee location, to be determined. (Families enrolled the week of July 19-23 will be notified of the location.)

Enrollment & Fees: The number of participants in each course is based on the appropriate instructor/student ratio, and is therefore, limited. Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. Fees for each course are listed next to the course descriptions. A \$20 non-refundable deposit per course is due at the time of registration to be applied toward the course fee.

Hours: Morning courses are 8:30-11:30 a.m. Afternoon courses are 1:00-4:00 p.m. Middle School U is open 7:30 a.m.-5:45 p.m. each week day. Students enrolled in a morning course can arrive as early as 7:30 a.m. Students enrolled in an afternoon course can remain as late as 5:45 p.m. Those participants staying for a full day are provided a supervised lunch hour.

Qualified and Experienced Staff: Courses are led by instructors and area businesses selected for their course-related skills and experience with and interest in working with middle school students. Middle School U is also staffed by a site director and youth leaders who assist instructors. They supervise and support students during non-course time.

Snacks and Lunches: Students who stay for the full day need to bring their own lunch which does not require refrigeration or heating. Milk is provided for lunch and snack which is available mid-morning and mid-afternoon.

Course Locations: The majority of Middle School U courses are taught at Centennial Park. Some courses are taught off-site at area businesses. Each course's location is listed with the course description.

Off-Site Courses & Field Trips: Transportation from the Middle School U site for field trips or to other course locations is provided by school bus, shuttle bus or van. Due to the number of courses and the number of students being transported, the bus or van schedule may vary 10 to 15 minutes. It is imperative that students taking off-site courses be on time for the start of their courses, 8:30 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. Buses will not be held for late arrivals. Course transportation schedules for the current week will be available at Centennial Park for the convenience of students and parents.

Non-Course Time: Middle School U staff members supervise free choice, independent activities before and after course time and during the lunch hour. There is no additional charge for this time.

Participation in Middle School U: Every student enrolled in Middle School U is afforded the opportunity for full participation, including all planned activities and field trips, unless restricted by a special need that cannot be accommodated. Each registration that indicates that a participant has special needs or other health concerns will be reviewed to determine necessary accommodations that will best meet the needs of the individual students in an effort to provide a safe and successful environment for everyone. Middle School U will work with parents to create an accommodation plan that meets the needs of the student and the program.

Special Needs/Behavioral Concerns: We acknowledge that Middle School U may not meet the individual needs of all participants and families enrolled. The first week of attendance in the program is probationary. When it is found that a student is experiencing difficulty due to a special need or inappropriate behavior, the Middle School U staff will work with the participant and family to help retain the student within the program. However, Middle School U reserves the right to remove a student from the program upon one week's notice if it is determined that the individual's behavior is considered too disruptive, or if the student has considerations that cannot be accommodated within the normal staffing pattern. Should the safety of staff or other students be jeopardized, immediate termination of enrollment may result.

Sunscreen/Insect Repellent: Middle School U students are responsible for supplying and applying their own sunscreen and insect repellent. Middle School U staff, instructors and contracted businesses are not responsible for these applications. Parents who wish their children to be protected on a daily basis, especially for courses planned for the out-of-doors, should discuss this with their child and provide them with the needed sunscreen and/or repellent.

Acknowledgement of Risk Forms: Courses that include the use of contracted instruction from other organizations include the need for a signed Acknowledgement of Risk form. The forms will be mailed with your confirmation letter if you choose a course for which this is necessary.

Lost, Stolen or Damaged Personal Property: Middle School U is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged personal property, including clothing. Students are discouraged from bringing personal items beyond what is needed for the day.

Keeping Parents Informed: Once registered for Middle School U, parents will receive a confirmation letter with important information about Middle School U, including program policies. During the summer, the sign-in area will have posters or notices providing important information. Parents should feel free to contact our office or the onsite director with questions or concerns.

Course Descriptions

Active Team Games

Fee: \$80

Share the ball! Share the fun! Learn the essentials of team play and its importance to group games such as "Capture the Flag" and competitive sports like soccer. Student will play their own favorite games and some they haven't tried before. Participants should be prepared for a high level of physical activity indoors and out, and need to dress in a way that allows them to move—fast!

Baking

Fee: \$100

Students will learn basic baking skills from a local baker. They will bake at a local bakery with instruction from the owner and baker. Students will also have a chance to experiment with and sample a variety of treats at Centennial Park and will also learn about various herbs and grains.

Ball Games & Sports

Fee: \$85

This week will include a host of active games played with all kinds of balls. Koosh balls, hacky sacks, playground balls, basketballs and soccer balls will all be included. The week will focus on variety and offer a chance to play traditional games like kick ball, and non-traditional games like Bocce Ball. Students should be prepared with clothes and shoes appropriate for a high level of activity.

Baseball

Fee: \$90

Bases loaded! From the sandlot to Cooperstown, participants will explore the game of baseball while learning the skills, strategies, and fun of the playing and enjoying this classic American pastime. The course emphasis is on sportsmanship and recreation and will include some games of kickball just for fun!

Basketball

Fee: \$80

"Get your game on, because court is in session!" Students will learn new skills and improve the ones they have - dribbling, passing, driving and shooting. Playing a variety of games and practicing fast paced drills will build students' individual player skills, teamwork skills and sportsmanship.

Bilingual One-Act Play

Fee: \$95

Students will learn and perform a one-act play in English and then learn and perform that same play in Spanish. This will be a fun play with parts for everyone! Actors will spend the week learning parts, staging and rehearsing the play, as well as creating the set and personal costumes. The final performance will be shared with other Middle School U students and families at the end of the week. Experience speaking Spanish is not required.

Fee: \$85

Students will "fly solo" and also work in "crews" to find their area of expertise and then share skills and knowledge. The course will include a field trip to the airport and an all day field trip to the EAA (Experiential Aircraft Association) in Oshkosh.

How to Register

Complete a registration packet for each student you wish to enroll in Middle School U. Please complete all forms entirely or registration may be delayed due to insufficient information.

The Registration Packet contains the following forms:

Part I - Registration Form. Complete form entirely. Be sure to check the desired departure procedure for the student and list persons other than parents who are authorized to pick up. Refer to the course choices in this booklet or online, and indicate the weeks and courses for which the student is registering.

Part II - Health History & Emergency Care Plan. The student's health history and emergency care plan must be periodically reviewed and updated by parents or guardians. Students enrolling in Middle School U for the first time must complete this form entirely prior to participation in any course. Families with health and emergency information on file with Wisconsin Youth Company administrative office need only provide updated information from the pre-printed form provided to them. A minimum of two emergency contacts other than parents must be listed on the health form. Forms missing required information will not be processed.

Part III - Account Security Form. This form must be completed in order to protect the privacy of your account. Your Account Access Password will be required for all account inquiries and change requests. This form also includes credit card payment options.

Part IV - Middle School U 2010 Agreement. Be sure to read thoroughly before signing. Please retain your copy.
Payment of Fees: Submit a \$20.00 per course down payment for each student. This down payment is non-refundable and non-transferable, and is applied toward the course fee. Down payments must accompany the completed forms in order to be processed.
Fee Payments: Fees may be paid by cash, check, money order, VISA, or Master Card. Make checks payable to WISCONSIN YOUTH COMPANY.

Financial Assistance: Limited scholarship funds may be available on a first-come, first-served basis. In order to provide an enriching experience for as many eligible students as possible, available scholarships are limited to one course for each eligible student for the summer.
